Retaining and attracting talents: Luxembourg in the top ten

When it comes to producing and retaining talent, European countries rank at the very top, according to the Global Talent Competitiveness Index, which looks at nations' ability to nurture and keep a talented workforce.

The top 10 includes only two countries outside of Europe, Singapore and the United States. Other nations with the best talent pools include Switzerland (1st), Denmark, Sweden, Luxembourg and the Netherlands.

The study compared 103 countries, scoring each nation with data that fell into six categories, including retaining talent, growing labor and vocational skills
